

BIRBHUM.—No. 15166L.A./1R-4/64.—29th September 1965.—Whereas the functions of the Central Government under the Land Acquisition Act, 1894 (Act I of 1894), in relation to the acquisition of land for the purpose of the Union, have been entrusted to the State Government by notification No. 20/1/55Judl.(1), dated the 14th May 1955, issued by the Government of India, in the Ministry of Home Affairs, under clause (1) of article 258 of the Constitution of India, as S.R.O. 1074 and published at page 868, Part II, section 3 of "Gazette of India", dated the 21st May 1955;

And whereas the Governor is satisfied that land is needed for a public purpose, namely, for the construction of double line on the Sahibganj Loop (Loop Line) between Sainthia and Barharwa (from mile post 146 to mile post 148) in the villages of (1) Paikpara, jurisdiction list No. 57, (2) Diha, jurisdiction list No. 58, police-station Nalhati, parganas Dhaoa, Sahajadpur, district Birbhum, it is hereby declared that pieces of land comprising cadastral plots, as detailed below and measuring, more or less, 0.135 of an acre, are needed for the aforesaid public purpose at the public expense within the aforesaid villages.
